

Why Reading 20 Minutes a Night is so Critical

Key to successful learning: reading

Regular reading opportunities, either as the reader or listening to stories.

Finding out what genre you enjoy as a reader and being supported in assessing material that is appealing to you.

Talking about what you have read and developing a deeper understanding of the text.





Key to successful learning: writing

Key to successful learning: maths MF

- Regular and rapid recall of doubles and halves, timestables including use of TTRS.

- Using maths knowledge regularly in everyday situations/games.

Reading Progress

The Teams app aims to help teachers quickly assess students' fluency at reading through video and audio recordings.

The app lets teachers upload a single reading fluency passage for the whole class, or provide different passages to suit students at various reading levels. Students record what they read and send it to their teacher for review.

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
