



# Why Reading 20 Minutes a Night is so Critical

Student A	Student B	Student C
20 minutes per day	5 minutes per day	1 minute per day
3,600 minutes per school year	900 minutes per school year	180 minutes per school year
1,800,000 words per year	282,00 words per year	8,000 words per year
Scores in the 90th percentile on standard tests.	Scores in the 50th percentile on standardized tests.	Scores in the 10th percentile on standardized tests.



#### READING BOOKS



In the reading record book, please ask your child to record the **book title** and **dates** your child has read during the week.

Please return to school on Fridays.

There is no need for your child to write anything. Instead, we will ask them what they like about the book in book chats.



To read every day and talk about the text.

#### WRITING

The English curriculum now has a greater focus on grammar and spelling.

- Children are taught spelling rules and patterns following on from the Read Write inc scheme used in KS1
- Children are taught to write a range of different sentences e.g. commands, questions and statements.
- They are taught to select verbs, adjectives and adverbs appropriately and effectively
- They are taught to begin sentences in different ways
- Taught to organise idea logically grouping sentences appropriately into paragraphs
- They then need to apply this information to a particular text type
- Taught to use so, because, after when etc. to join clauses together.





# Y3 WRITING NON-NEGOTIABLES

- I make capital letters tall and I make sure that they do not join to any other letter.
- I only write a capital letter if I need one.
- I spell words correctly if they are written for me to copy.
- I do not use an apostrophe to make a word plural.

We also expect good presentation and an increased amount of writing e.g. working towards one page in a big write.

# Y3 MATHS NON-NEGOTIABLES

- We will consolidate addition and subtraction facts within 20, e.g. 15 - 7 = 8
- We will consolidate multiplication and division facts for the 2 times table (linked to doubles /halves).
- We will consolidate multiplication and division facts for the 3, 5 and 10 times tables.
- We will learn multiplication and division facts for 4, 6, 8 and 11 times tables.
- By the end of Year 3, children should know multiplication and division facts for the 2,3,4,5,6,8 and 11 times tables.

### PHYSICAL ACTIVITY
