

RWI

Children work in small groups, continuing the Read, Write Inc program.

They will read each day to an adult and to their partner.

RWI philosophy:

When learning to read it takes three days to read a book.


Day 1 - decoding



Key to successful learning: Maths



Curriculum

Read, write, represent, partition, compare and order numbers up to 100.

Add and subtract 2-digit numbers.

Draw and measure lengths in centimetres and compare and order lengths in centimetres and metres.

Estimate measurements.



At home support

Counting in 2's, 5's and 10's Number bonds to 20 to aid fluency

Science

Looking at the human lifecycle, thinking about how children have changed since they were babies and finding out about the lifecycles of other animals and what they need to survive.

Art

The element of line. Sketching natural objects, observing closely, showing light and dark areas in drawings.

ICT

Re-cap basic computer skills, such as turning a computer on and off safely and opening and closing documents. Children will have a go at printing and continue to develop keyboard skills.

RE

Creation: Consider what they could do to care for God's world in their lives and their local community


