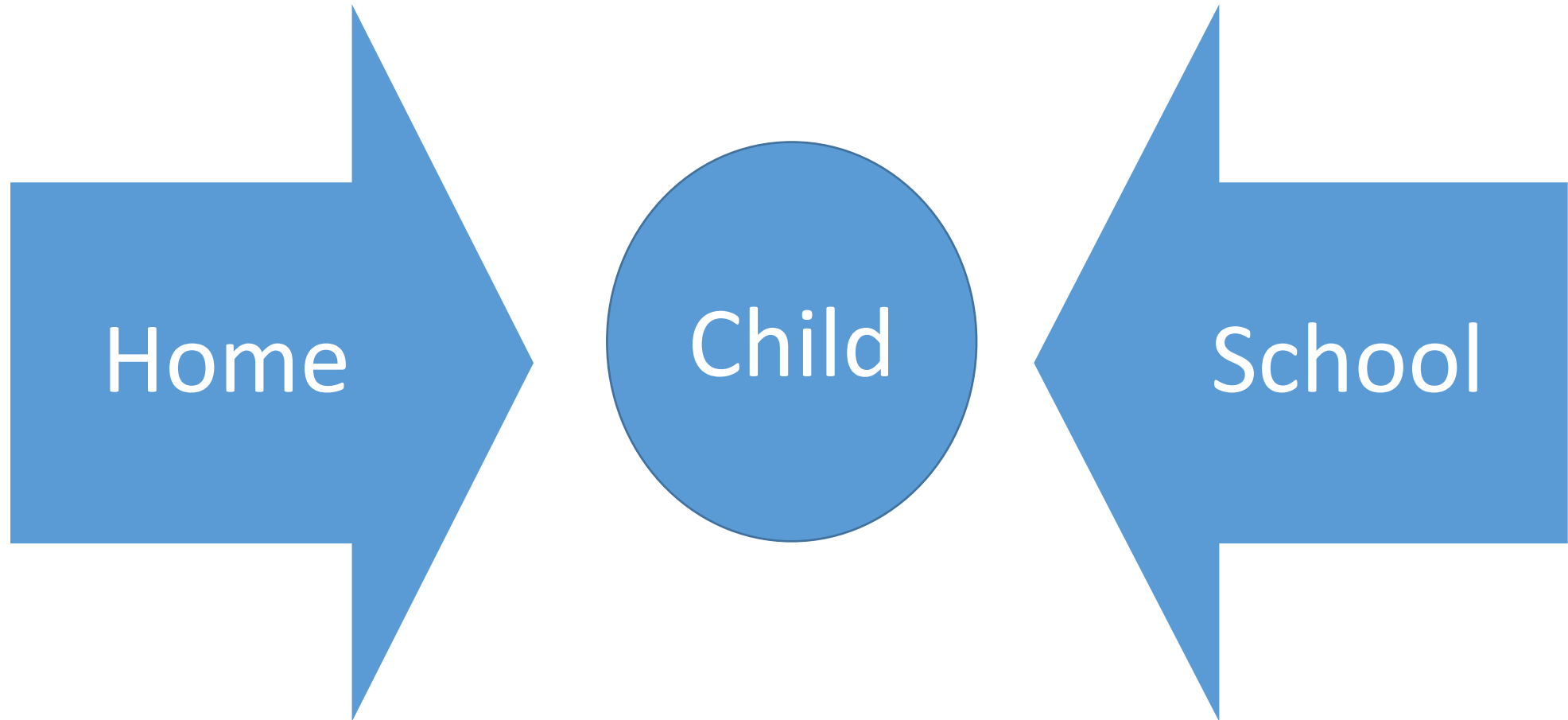

Reading to your child is important too.

Why Reading 20 Minutes a Night is so Critical

Student A	Student B	Student C
20 minutes per day	5 minutes per day	1 minute per day
3,600 minutes per school year	900 minutes per school year	180 minutes per school year
1,800,000 words per year	282,00 words per year	8,000 words per year
		
Scores in the 90th percentile on standard tests.	Scores in the 50th percentile on standardized tests.	Scores in the 10th percentile on standardized tests.

Key to successful learning: reading

Regular reading opportunities, either as the reader or listening to stories.

Finding out what genre you enjoy as a reader and being supported in assessing material that is appealing to you.

Talking about what you have read and developing a deeper understanding of the text.





Key to successful learning: writing

Year 5

- I am able to write at least one page in half an hour if required.
- I end every sentence with appropriate punctuation

- I use an apostrophe correctly for contractions and possession.
- Beautiful presentation in all work.

Key to successful learning: maths

- Regular and rapid recall of doubles and halves, times tables including use of TTRS.
- Increasing flexibility to express fractions as decimals and percentages.
- Reducing any factors that cause 'maths anxiety'.
- Using maths knowledge regularly in everyday situations/games.

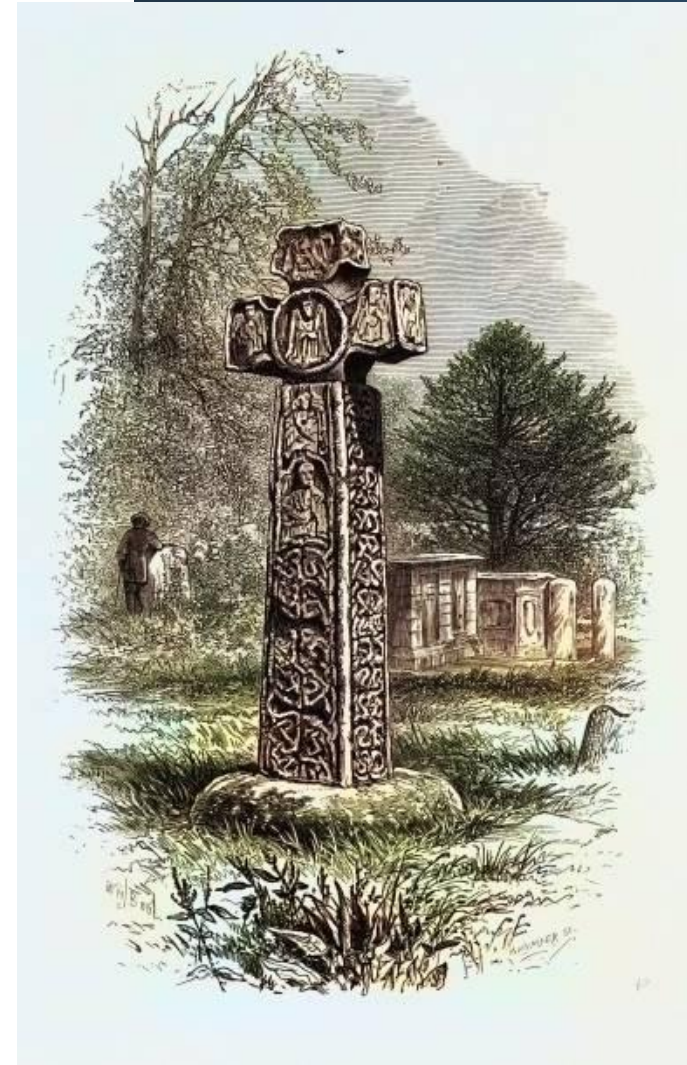
