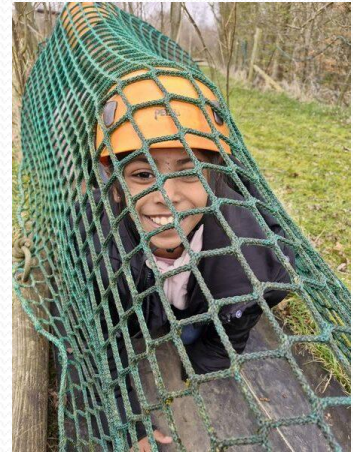

Thursday 9th- Friday 10th July 2026

£120 provisional cost (subject to change/we are hoping to reduce this slightly)

- We will set up a suggested scheme of paying in 6 instalments to spread the cost. There will be an option to pay in full if you wish. We are aiming to have payments set up in October/ November.

- We will be asking parents to support us in taking the children **to Castleton** on Thursday morning to avoid the expensive cost of a coach! Parents may choose to lift share.





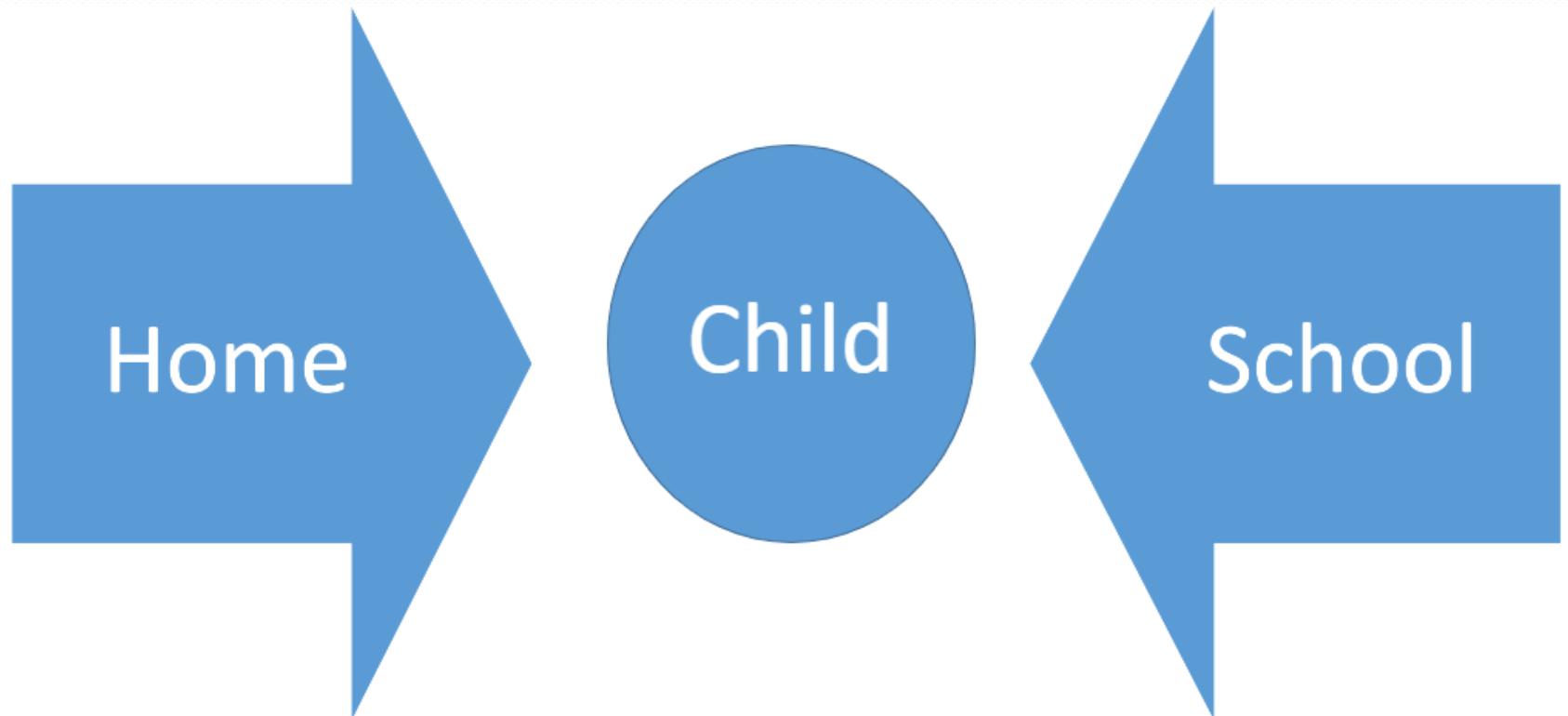

Key to successful learning



Key to successful learning: happiness, joy and fun!

Support at school:

Happy atmosphere

Healthy minds check-in

Time to talk with adults

Emails, telephone calls, gate chats

Morning routines



Support at home:

Talking about how they feel

Homework support

Encouragement with their learning



Key to successful learning: Routine and structure

- Punctual and ready to learn – a calm start to the day with key learning taking place
- Uniform and PE kit (Tuesday and Thursday)
- Healthy snacks and water bottle
- Reading every day (to an adult as much as possible)
- Regular times tables work
- Homework completed each week (more detail on this later)








Key to successful learning: Reading

- Reading for pleasure
- Guided reading (as a class or in small groups)
- Reading to an adult or with a sibling
- Reading interventions – Lexia, Spelling Zappers etc.

Children **learn to read** so they can **read to learn**.

Why Reading 20 Minutes a Night is so Critical

Key to successful learning: Writing

- Use joined handwriting.
- Read and edit work before I show it to the teacher.
- Use capital letters for proper nouns.
- Organise work into paragraphs.





Key to successful learning: Maths

- Times tables knowledge (and division) up to 12×12
- Regular arithmetic
- Schofield and Sims support
- Baking, shopping, car journeys etc.

Multiplication Check

- The multiplication tables check is statutory for primary schools. This will take place in **June**.
- The MTC is an online test where the pupils are asked 25 questions on times tables 2 to 12.
- For every question they have 6 seconds to answer and in between the questions there is a 3 second rest.
- Questions about the 6, 7, 8, 9, and 12 times table come up more often.
- The questions are generated randomly.

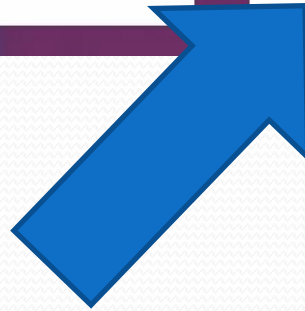

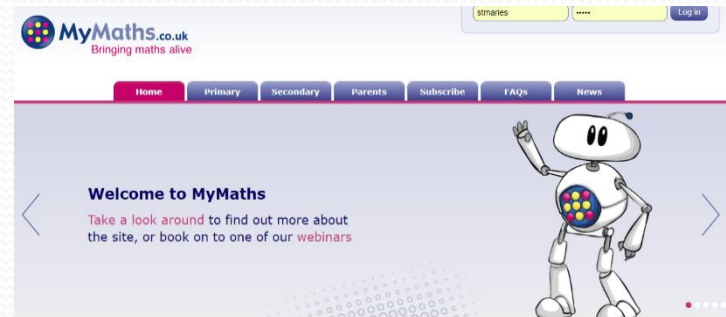
